Winter Projects

Last month we highlighted the cost effective benefits of refreshing the granite in your landscape. This month we would like to take that a step farther and emphasize that erosion repair and adding "dry washes" to your landscape.

If you have areas that typically carry run off water, we can clean them up and add Decorative Rip Rap to make them more aesthetically pleasing. Rip Rap will also help aerify and slow the water so it reduces the erosion down stream. The heavier rock will also remain in the intended location much longer.

Having Drainage Issues?

Do you have problems with water draining properly in your turf areas? Worried about summer mosquito issues? We now have a solution that is non-invasive, actually treats the soil, improving turf response, and works in a majority of locations. .

While this very cost effective treatment is an ongoing process, it also contains slow release fertilizers. In conjunction with aeration and other soil amendments, this treatment can significantly increase the percolation rate in the turf retention areas.

This month in Landscaping

Now that the Rye Grass is in and germinated, we are making the first mow and fertilization of the winter. Due to the warm weather, many of the watering times were much higher than years past so this will reflect in your water bills. Since the weather has cooled and the seed has germinated, along with some rain, we have significantly cut the water times back.

The Rye grass will be tall prior to the first mowing if it has not happened yet. We will mow high the first time to even it out and look for other areas that may need spot seeded. The grass will be gradually taken down to shorten the height of the now dormant Bermuda which started to come back with the warm weather, then let grow to a regular height of approximately 2".

If you live in a community that you want an extra boost, we can apply liquid iron which is a little trick golf courses use to help green up the turf. Just let us know and we will provide a proposal for you.

Again this month, we will continue to cut down the Mexican Bird of Paradise which will grow back next spring. Many other shrubs start to look dry or stressed this time of year because of the colder weather. Most of these we will not trim on so they insulate themselves. After mid February, we will cut them back to grow back to their natural appearance..
