This month in Landscaping

Even though we have some cold weather still ahead, it is time to prepare for spring cut backs.

A few reasons to perform these cut backs are to remove dead branches, frosted leaves, and most importantly renew the look of the shrub for summer. A spring cut back can reduce it to half the size of the shrub or even as low as 1-2" in height in plants such as Lantana, Bougainvillea or Birds of Paradise.

The shrubs may look bare but their appearance in 30-60 days will be worth the wait. This is an important bit of information to let everyone know. This is a normal process of proper shrub maintenance. This also allows the crew to remove any debris from under the shrub and check for irrigation problems.

Keeping a natural look all year long (no shaping) is better for the shrubs and also leads to less water usage & better blooming. Removing all of the woody looking branches gives the appearance of all new shrubs.

Once this "hard prune" has been completed, elevating trees, and more summer preparations will be the ongoing theme.

This is also the time to spray Olive Trees!
