Winter Lawns

It certainly turned cold in time for the winter holidays! This cold weather is hard on the winter lawns as well.

There is always a balancing act to do as the weather cools off in October. Plant the winter Rye too soon and the heat will kill it, too late and it will take a significantly longer time to germinate.

Considering this and the need to get the turf fertilized before it is too cold to break down makes for a small window of opportunity.

These latest cold snaps have sent the Bermuda that was still hanging on and growing with the Rye, into a brown dormant state. We will be cutting the grass a little lower one time to take the Bermuda down so that it does not show.

The next step will be to let the Rye grow taller than before to let more of the blades be exposed to sun and increase photosynthesis and chlorophyll which turns the grass green. Coupled with an application of Calcium Nitrate, the turf should be back in shape soon.

This month in Landscaping

According to the Landscape Planner, we will be fertilizing this month. Our contracts state that the winter lawns will be fertilized 3 times. We usually are spreading some type of fertilizer every month to keep everything looking its best. This equates to almost double what we guarantee. See the Winter Lawns article to the left.

Now is a good time to have your Olive Trees trimmed. This will also help when you have them sprayed in February.

If you are set up for Pre-emergent weed control, we will be treating your granite areas at this time. If you are not set up or don't know if you are, please contact us to get this done. Constant treatment is needed to reduce the number of weeds growing each season. Manual removal is sometimes more harmful and creates more weeds if not chemically treated first.

Think ahead to January when it is still too cold to plant, but a perfect time to top coat your granite. Nothing freshens the look of your surroundings more quickly than a new top coat to cover thinning, faded, and broken down granite.
