As we mentioned in the adjacent article, it is the planting season! Summer color is an easy way to enhance your environment.

With a couple of weeks of warmer weather following some substantial rains, weeds are very prominent. You need to look no further than open fields and the urban mountains to see that the weed crop this year is significantly greater than the last few years. While consistent pre-emergent is the primary defense, patience with the process of using systemic weed control chemicals is a must for long term control. After spraying, weeds must be left to die before removal so the chemicals can reach the roots. If the weeds are removed too quickly, they will simply grow back from the roots. Weed season happens at least twice per year, every year and we realize homeowner's do forget about this but patience is the key.

Along with the weeds, the Bermuda begins to wake up with warmer weather. If you are not overseeded, we will begin to slowly increase watering times to encourage Bermuda growth. Once the weather is warmer at night, we will fertilize and it will begin to green up and grow. For overseeded turf areas, we will maintain the Rye as long as we responsibly can. Bermuda needs approximately 100 days of active growing to maintain good health. This is in addition to the 6-8 hours of direct sunlight needed during the growing season.
