## This month in Landscaping

Right now most of your winter lawns are just beginning to germinate, have germinated and are being spot seeded, or maybe looking a little shaggy! The timing of this in most cases was the condition of the irrigation system. Some irrigation systems just needed more care than others to prepare them for the high demand of Winter Rye Seed germination.

Once the spot seed has germinated, the watering schedule will be significantly reduced.

As mentioned last month, the first mow should not occur until the grass has developed enough root structure so that the mowers do not pull it out. Following the first mow, fertilizer will be applied to strengthen the grass in preparation for potential frost.

The next task for November is cutting back the Mexican Bird of Paradise. It does not like the cold and some are already looking rough. We cut these back so when the new shoots come back in the spring, it looks like a fresh new shrub with lots of color.

One of the most dramatic changes for November is the installation of Winter Annual Flowers. While October can see some installations, November is normally without the high temperature days that can wilt the new flowers.
