Communication

Since our restructuring last year, Asset Landscaping has been changing the way we do business. One of those areas is putting in place the tools to make communication easier, more detailed, more easily available, and more prompt.

We are not where we want to be, however you should take advantage of what we do have to offer. For starters, our managers receive an Activity Task List which shows all of the communications, both internally, and externally that occur regarding the account. It also shows when and what time an irrigation tech visited your account as well as when a supervisor was there. It is not just the maintenance crew that comes to take care of your landscaping. It is a collection of managers, supervisors, owners, and irrigation techs. There are also times when a soil sample is taken or an outside party is ask to take a look at something so we can get expert advise on property issues. There are several people involved with your landscaping that you will probably never see. With the Activity Task List, you will know they have been there looking out for your best interests. There are so many people from other parts of the country that have never been exposed to this summer to winter transition. It can be quite disturbing to see the nice green grass mowed literally to death if you don't know what to expect. For this reason, we want to make sure that the information is passed along to save us all "some of those calls". Trimming will also be pushed back due to the extreme amount of labor it takes to scalp the grass.

Once the seed is down, it will be almost 45 days before we can mow it. The grass will be "too long" and look "unkempt" to repeat some terms used in the past. This is necessary for all of the seed to properly germinate. Rye will not "crawl" to cover up bare spots so what you see is what you get. This is why we need to protect the Rye until it is really ready to be mowed.

While we wait for time to mow again, we spend a lot of time trimming shrubs, and taking care of other projects that have taken a back seat during the scalping process.
